2018 Recreation Residence Deck Stain List

Written approval is required prior to all painting or staining.

Choosing the right color for cabins, decks and outbuildings helps to meet the goals of the Recreation Residence program to prevent urbanization and maintain the natural forest setting. We look for colors that will cause buildings and decks to almost "disappear" when viewed from a distance. These are generally darker and muted shades of brown and green.

Below are examples of colors that allow decks and buildings to blend into in the forest landscape. Other brands and colors that match these colors may be used after a sample is submitted and Forest Service written approval is received.

The manufacturer or brand is in **bold underlined**, with the stain color names below it.

- Stain colors that have a red, yellow or orange tint are to be avoided. Most colors with
 the words "redwood" and "cedar" are <u>not approved</u> because they tend to have a red,
 yellow or orange tint.
- "Natural" or clear sealers are typically <u>not approved</u> for new bare wood because the result is a light, high contrast color that "pops out" in a forest setting.
